It was a good start for the M-----, nope I'm not going to say it, the new year. Was a little cool to kick off the morning but warmed up to a glorious day. We had 22 shooters including Todd Schuler from Plano at his first match. I hope we can maintain the trend ( if one can be a trend ) of a new shooter each month. Just take a minute and look around during the match and notice that we are turning grayer or shinier, if we don't get some young shooters started, who is going to pull all of the targets in a few years.

If you want to find out what it takes to get to the top, ask Madison Shambarger. In the last couple of matches he has shot to the top on the strength of his standing scores. While he was always one of the strongest prone shooters at the match, it is the improved off hand scores that are making him a winner today. I didn't have a chance to ask him, but I suspect he has invested in dry firing and a lot of practice rounds from this "most challenging" of the positions. It is great to see the improvement in our shooters. Madison agged out at 484-15x and won the 600 yard match with a fine 198-9x. Tommy Williams was the Master class winner and the standing match winner (another one that has been practicing). In the expert class, Rol Coggins held off the rush with a solid 466-5x finish and Jason Rhynard (remember young Jason from years past) was the sharpshooter winner with a great 461-10x. Bob Quinn was the high marksman with a strong finish at 600.

We have talked about adding some extra shooting to the match. A little history, March 2 is Texas Independence Day and the next match is only a couple of days later. I think this would be a good time to have an infantry trophy match following the regular match. If Col. Travis would have us, I think we could have been a great help to him. The course of fire will be modified from the standard to help some of the new shooters get their feet under them. Bring at least 50 rounds extra and it should take about an hour to complete. This will be good training for the upcoming state match and regionals. Remember, all service rifles.

Let me preach a little. As with most other things in life, ignorance of the rules doesn't get you any sympathy. If you need a rule book or help figuring out the rules of the game, speak up. Somethings are changing as we speak and being current is beneficial to you. Remember, while you are scoring, you become an extension of the match director and you are to call to his attention any rules violations. Get you a rule book and get to know it.
