Panola County Gun Club receives NRA grant

The Panola County Gun Club, located in the Deadwood area, was a recent recipient of a National Rifle Association Range Grant.

POGC used the NRA grant funds to improve the range road, which had degraded during the wet winter/spring weather. The Panola County Gun Club was founded in 1987 by Ben Sepaugh and Wilburn Spiller as a high power rifle competition range and is now owned and managed by its members. The club is also the home range of the Texas State Rifle Association Service Rifle team, who hold 12 national ri-

the team championship titles as well as numerous individual national championship titles.

In fact, two club members have won the President's 100 championship. Members enjoy 50, 100 and 200-yard ranges with benches and a 600-yard range with 16 target carriers and pits to practice marksmanship fundamentals. The club hosts high power across-the-course (200, 300, and 600-yard) competitions along with mid-range prone (at 300, 500, and 600 yards), small bore prone (.22 caliber rifle at 50 and 100 yards), and precision pistol (at 25 and 50 yard) matches.
