Tournament Dates: Matches are generally held the first Saturday of the first full weekend of the month unless noted in the table below or published otherwise on the Club's website. Deviations from this norm are indicated with an * (not normal schedule) or ^ (pre-registration required and governed by a separate match program). Match dates are as shown in the following table:

Range Location: ~ 5221 FM 2517, Carthage, TX (NOT a mailing address). GPS: 32°- 7'- 4" North / 94°- 9'-10" West. [Google maps](#) will also bring you to the range.

Range Access: Entrance gate will be unlocked ~ 30 min prior to registration closing time. Close gate behind you. Gate will be locked ~ when the first competitors go to the pits / start of the first preparation period.

Governing Rules: Matches designated as "Club" will be run in accordance with NRA High Power Rifle. Links to

the current NRA and CMP rulebooks may be found on the Club website. Competitors are responsible for being aware of the Match Program; following all posted safety regulations as well as those announced at the match safety brief; and knowing the contents of the current applicable rule book.

Competitor Eligibility: Eligibility is governed by CMP section 3.0 and NRA rules 1.7(c) and 1.7 (e).

Match Fees: All matches, whether Club or sanctioned, are \$25 for adults or \$15 juniors (under 21 on the competition day).

Entries / Registration: Except for the Regional where pre-registration is required, registration is on the day of the match at the 200 yard line. Entries close at 7:30 AM. Note that the January, February, and December matches will start at 9 AM, so those entries close at 8:30.

Entry Limit: The current maximum range capacity using electronic targets is 16 (8 firing points x 2 relays). This capacity may increase if more than 2 relays are shot and/or more electronic targets become available.

Match Start Time: Unless noted in the match schedule table, or published otherwise on the Club's website, matches begin at 8:00 AM. Note that the January, February, and December matches will start at 9 AM. Check-in closes 30 minutes prior to match start time.

Classification: For Club and NRA sanctioned matches, NRA Rule 19.6 "assigned classification" may be used. For CMP sanctioned matches, the CMP classification system will be used (Rule 4.10.6). Competitors who do not have a CMP Classification, but who have an NRA Classification may

compete with their current NRA Classification for their first match (Rule 4.10.8). Unclassified competitors and shooters without proof of classification will compete in the Master Class.

Targets & Duty: PCGC uses Shotmarker electronic (e-)targets. Competitors are required to bring their own electronic device to interface with the Shotmarker system. The URL is 192.168.100.1. Make sure the device is in airplane mode, WIFI source "Shotmarker" is selected, and no "www" is in front of the URL. An addendum may be published to this match program to further delineate PCGC practices concerning e-targets.

- If target pulling becomes necessary, e.g. issues with e-targets, competitors **MUST** wear hearing and eye protection in the pits
- At the completion of the match, competitors are requested to assist with refacing targets
- Competitors are urged to bring enough short-range ammo for a couple of extra strings and additional 600 yard ammo as electronic targets are prone to causing range alibis.
- An addendum may be published to this match program to delineate PCGC practices concerning e-targets.

Range Rules & Policies:

- No equipment on the firing line (or concrete) until the relay is called to the line. Each relay will be called to the line ~ 5 minutes prior to the start of the preparation period.
- On the firing-line, competitors as well as any observers must wear hearing protection. The use and proper wearing of eye protection by the competitor and scorer is required for CMP matches and is highly recommended for NRA and Club matches.
- Competitors must bring their own device by which to receive/view/record the electronic shot placement and value. PCGC will **NOT** provide devices nor power to charge devices.
- Brass must be picked up, even if the competitor does not want to keep it.
- Trash must be placed in a trash bag, where available, or leave with the competitor.
- Speed limit on range roads is 15 mph.
- Chamber Flags: The use of an empty chamber indicator (ECI) is always required even while the rifle is in the case. Only during a preparation period or actual firing may the ECI be removed from the rifle. ECI's may be purchased for \$1.00 each.
- Magazines and loading blocks may only be inserted in the rifle during the preparation period or live firing.
- **Level-loading is required.** Rifles must be pointed at the impact berm or lower while closing the bolt.
- Parking is to either side of the 600 yard line.
- Electronic Devices: All electronic communication and audio devices forward of the ready line are to be silenced and communications disabled (NRA rule 3.22) Use of a cell phone to keep time is permitted only when "cellular data" is turned off, i.e., the phone is in airplane mode. Reminder, the use of radars, chronographs and other devices designed to measure bullet velocity are prohibited on the line (NRA rule 3.22 (c)).

Scoring: Competitors must perform scoring/verifier duties and be familiar with applicable rules NRA sections 10.17 and 14. The paper scorecard is the official record. It is the scorer's/verifier's duty to faithfully observe both the shooter and the electronic target monitor to guard against crossfires and spurious electronically recorded shots.

- Signed scorecards are to be turned in by the scorekeepers following the completion of each match.
- Errors on a scorecard should be crossed out and initialed by the scorer. Erasures and/or changes without the scorer's initials could disqualify the team for that match.

Course of Fire & Time Allotment:

Match#1: 200 YD SF, Target SR. Standing, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record, 22 minutes.

Match#2: 200 YD RF, Target SR. Sitting or kneeling, 2 sighting shots, 2-10 shot strings in 60 seconds per string.

Match#3: 300 YD RF, Target SR-3, Prone, 2 sighting shots, 2-10 shot strings in 70 seconds per string.

Match#4: 600 YD SF, Target MR-1, Prone, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record, 22 minutes.

Match#5: Aggregate Match: Total of Matches #1 thru #4.

Targets: 200yds SR; 300yds SR-3; 600yds MR1

Challenge Fee: \$1 will be charged for lost challenges. Challenges must be made immediately upon announcement of the score. No challenge will be accepted after the targets have been pasted. Scores may only be challenged prior to awards.

Equipment: The use of compensators or muzzle brakes is prohibited. Sound suppressors are not authorized for use in competition. Rifle types are divided into categories as follows:

- #1: Service Rifle (HP rule 3.1 a-e);

- #2: Any Rifle (HP rule 3.2) and Match Rifle (NRA HP rule 3.3). CMP defines rifles in Section 5.

Ammunition: Competitors are required to furnish their own safe ammunition. Any defective or unsafe ammunition will be removed from the firing line. Any competitor that cannot get/stay on target will be removed from the firing line. No tracers or AP are allowed. No calibers larger than 0.35 may be used at PCGC. All 5.56 / .223 ammunition must utilize a 62-grain or heavier bullet at the 600 yard-line.

Coaching: Is not permitted during a limited sighting period (CMP HP rule 4.5 and NRA HP Rule 9.2). Any competitor that cannot get/stay on target will be removed from the firing line.

Electronic Devices: All electronic communication and audio devices forward of the ready line are to be silenced and communications disabled (CMP HP rule 5.5.8 and NRA HP rule 3.22) This prohibition applies when shooting, scoring, and, when applicable, performing pit duties. Use of a cell phone to keep time is permitted only when “cellular data” is turned off, i.e., the phone is in airplane mode. Further all devices or equipment which may facilitate shooting are forbidden (NRA rule 3.18), this includes chronographs of all types during competition.

Challenge Period: The challenge period will end 15 minutes after the completion of the match, but not before competitors in the pits return to the firing line. The statistics officer will resolve all protests.

Results: Match results will be temporarily posted on the Club home page, www.epcgc.com, and then archived by year at https://epcgc.com/?page_id=4441. Competitors will be able to download and save / print their own results.

Awards: A club medallion instead of cash will be awarded to the top-scoring (grand aggregate) competitor (combined all rifle types) unless there are 5 or more rifle types, e.g. Service rifle, Match/Any rifle). If a competitor does not want a club medallion, they will be awarded \$5.00. Provided there are 5 or more competitors, match winners will receive \$3.00. Class winners will only be recognized if there are 6 or more competitors in a class such that the 1st in class will receive \$3.00. If there are 9 or more competitors in a class, the 2nd in class will receive \$2.00.
