Range Access: Entrance gate will be unlocked ~ 6:45 AM (Saturday/Sunday). Gate will be re-locked prior to start of the first relay.

Entries: Entry forms completed/submitted electronically. For rifle complete 2 entry forms:

Advanced entries are required. As this is also the Club championship, PCGC members will have preferred squadding thru Monday, September 7. Non-club members will be squadded as range capacity permits.

- Entry (via Targetscore link above) **and** payment of fees must be received by **Monday, November 9, 2026**.
- Entries will be considered standby until payment is received.
- Completed registrations (entry + payment) will be acknowledged by email from the Match Director.
- Payment can be made by mailing a check or money order payable to “Panola County Gun Club” or via electronic payment (Zelle or Venmo). The payment link above provides complete details.
- Competitors **MUST** bring an electronic device capable of interfacing with the electronic target system (Shotmarker)

Entry Limit: For rifle, the field will be limited to the first 40 individuals if utilizing e-targets (4 relays & 10 e-targets). Priority will be given for competitors shooting both days. A waitlist will be established after capacity is reached and will be filled by date payment received pending availability of additional e-targets.

Entry Fees: For the 120-shot Regional PCGC members \$65 adults/\$30 juniors; non-PCGC members \$75 adults/\$40 juniors. Sunday only competitors: PCGC members \$40 adults/\$20 juniors; non-PCGC members \$55 adults/\$30 juniors.

Refunds: Before Monday, November 16^h, 100% refunded. “No shows” will not be refunded.

Daily Start Time: Check-in will begin at 7:00 AM at the 600-yard line. Safety Brief is at 7:30 and the match begins at 8:00 AM.

- NO GEAR OR RIFLES ON THE LINE UNTIL RELAY IS CALLED TO THE LINE

Governing Rules: Current NRA High Power Rifle and F-Class Rifle rules apply

Competitors are responsible for:

- Being aware of the match program
- Following all posted safety regulations as well as those announced at the match / during the safety brief
- Knowing the contents of the current, applicable rule book especially those pertaining to electronic target

scoring rules and protests.

The Match Director reserves the right to disqualify any unsafe rifle, ammunition, or competitor. The Match Director reserves the right to modify the course of fire and/or relay rotations based on the number of shooters, weather, and/or range conditions.

Classifications: The competitor will utilize their NRA classification for the Regional, or CMP if they do not have an NRA classification. Unclassified competitors will compete in the Master class.

Challenge Fee: \$2 will be charged for each challenge but will be refunded if challenge is sustained. All scores are tentative until publication of the final bulletin. Notify the Statistical Officer of any apparent errors.

Targets: Face: MR-1 and MR-1 F as applicable. There will be a seven (7) second delay on F-Class targets.

Course of Fire: Competitors will be pre-squadded. It is anticipated that this match will be fired on electronic targets. Competitors must have their own device to interface with the Shotmarker target.

- **Saturday, 5 December:** Regional 60 record shots with sighters as detailed below.
 - Match #1: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #2: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #3: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #4: Day 1 Aggregate of matches #1-#3
- **Sunday, 65 December:**
 - Match #5: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, unlimited sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #6: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #7: 600 YD SF, Target MR1 or MR1F, 2 sighting shots, 20 shots for record
 - Match #8: Day 2 Aggregate of matches #5-#7
 - Match #9: Club Championship, aggregate of matches #5-#7
 - Match #10: Regional, aggregate of matches #4 and #8

Equipment: The use of compensators or muzzle brakes is prohibited. Sound suppressors are authorized for use in competition; competitors are responsible for compliance with applicable laws for possession/use. Rifle types are divided into 3 categories as follows:

- #A: Sling rifle consisting of Service Rifle (HP rule 3.1 a-e); Any/Match Rifle (HP rule 3.2/3.3); and Palma Rifle (HP Rule 3.3.1);
- #B: Tactical Rifle (AR) as defined by HP Rules Section 23 Tactical Rifles on the AR-Platform chambered in either .223 cal/5.56mm or larger than .223/5.56mm up to and including .308 cal. / 7.62mm;
- #C: F-Class which are defined by the F-Class rule book section 3 and are either Open (F-O); or F-Class Target Rifle (F/TR). The F-TR competitors may be separated from the F-Open for award purposes if more than 3 people are entered in the F-TR category.

Ammunition: Competitors are required to furnish their own safe ammunition. Any defective or unsafe ammunition will be removed from the firing line. Any competitor that cannot get/stay on target will be removed from the firing line. No tracers or AP are allowed. No calibers larger than 0.35 may be used at PCGC. All 5.56 / .223 ammunition must utilize a 62-grain or heavier bullet at the 600 yard-line.

Range Rules & Policies:

- No equipment on the firing line (or concrete) until the relay is called to the line. Each relay will be called to the line ~ 5 minutes prior to the start of the preparation period.
- On the firing-line, competitors as well as any observers must wear hearing protection.
- The use and proper wearing of eye protection by the competitor and scorer is highly recommended.
- Competitors must bring their own device by which to receive/view/record the electronic shot placement and value. PCGC will NOT provide devices nor power to charge devices.

- Brass must be picked up, even if the competitor does not want to keep it.
- Trash must be placed in a trash bag, where available, or leave with the competitor.
- Speed limit on range roads is 15 mph.
- Chamber Flags: The use of an empty chamber indicator (ECI) is always required even while the rifle is in the case. Only during a preparation period or actual firing may the ECI be removed from the rifle. ECI's may be purchased for \$1.00 each.
- Magazines and loading blocks may only be inserted in the rifle during the preparation period or live firing.
- Level-loading is required. Rifles must be pointed at the impact berm or lower while closing the bolt.
- Parking is to either side of the 600 yard line.
- Electronic Devices: All electronic communication and audio devices forward of the ready line are to be silenced and communications disabled (rule 3.22). Use of a cell phone to keep time is permitted only when "cellular data" is turned off, i.e., the phone is in airplane mode. Reminder, the use of radars, chronographs and other devices designed to measure bullet velocity are prohibited on the line (rule 3.22 (c)).

Scoring: Competitors must perform scoring/verifier duties and be familiar with applicable rules NRA sections 10.17 and 14. The paper scorecard is the official record. It is the scorer's/verifier's duty to faithfully observe both the shooter and the electronic target monitor to guard against crossfires and spurious electronically recorded shots.

- Signed scorecards are to be turned in by the scorekeepers following the completion of each match.
- Errors on a scorecard should be crossed out and initialed by the scorer. Erasures and/or changes without the scorer's initials could disqualify the team for that match.

Challenge Period: The challenge period will end 15 minutes after the posting of scores and when the competitors in the pits return to the firing line. The statistician officer will resolve all protests.

Range Amenities:

- Portable toilets are available behind the firing line and in the pits.
- There is no potable water at the range; competitors are encouraged to bring sufficient water or other non-alcoholic beverages for their personal consumption sufficient for the day.
- Shade canopies (personal) are only permitted in the parking area; no shade canopies behind the 600-yard line (area between the concrete and the tree line). Owners assume all risks.
- There will not be a lunch break.

Results: Match results will be temporarily posted on the Club home page, www.epcgc.com, and then archived by year at http://epcgc.com/?page_id=123. Competitors will be able to download and save/print their results.

Awards (for Regional & Club Championship):

- The Club Championship will be shot concurrently with the Regional as detailed in the course of fire. However, only a PCGC member can be named the Club Champion. The Club Champion, by rifle type, will be awarded a Club Champion plaque and will be eligible for all Regional classification, category, and aggregate awards.
- Grand aggregate place awards will be presented to the winners by rifle category.
- Match and classification awards will be made if there are a minimum of five competitors within that match / classification. Classes will be combined upward as required except that the High Master class will not be combined. If less than 5, the High Master classification will fire for place awards only.
- The number of classification awards is determined by the number of competitors within that classification. Second, third, fourth place, etc., awards will be given based on one award for each five (5) competitors, i.e., second 6-10; third 11-15, etc.

- Competitors winning a grand aggregate place award may not receive a Special Category Award.
- Competitors who receive a grand aggregate award will not receive a classification award for the grand aggregate score.
- A “Special Category Award” will be awarded based upon the Grand Aggregate scores if there are five (5) or more competitors in that special category. The Special Category Award recipients may receive classification awards for the individual stages.

NRA Distinguished Rifleman Award: Steps toward this distinguished award will be reported based on the Grand Aggregate (Match 10) score.

National Records: May be set in accordance with Section 17 of the current, applicable NRA rulebook. Competitors must be an NRA member to set a National Record. Courses of fire which National Records potentially be established are as follows:

- Highpower Rifle – 17.5 (w and x, any sights) 600 yds 20 shots; (ai) 60 shots in 20 shot strings at 600 yds
- F-Class Rifle – 17.5 (c) 600 yds 20 shots and (g) 60 shots in 20 shot strings at 600 yds
- Recognition for individual scores fired as a special group (“Police”, “Service”) may also be fired.
